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**Ejea de los Caballeros y Sos del Rey Católico**

A complete and balanced route that takes you around the northern part of the district, where you will pass through some mediaeval villages with a Roman past, to then go south, deep into the landscapes of steppe and irrigated land of La Bardena.

The route starts in Ejea de los Caballeros and goes in the direction of Luesia along the local Farasdués and Asín road. The climb from Ejea to Luesia is on a long 30-km uphill stretch of road, with a moderate and constant gradient. The route continues from the mediaeval village of Luesia to the monumental village of Uncastillo, ascending the hill of Collado de Itorre before heading towards Sos del Rey Católico, one of the district’s mediaeval gems, passing through Portillo de Baztanes. The ascent is short, but quite demanding at the end. Until you reach Sos, the stretches of road alternate forest areas with some lovely panoramic views of the Pyrenees.

After leaving the village, the route continues along the A-127 to climb the mythical mountain pass of Sos, to reach the top of the Puerto de Mamillas before descending to Sofuentes, Castiliscar, and Sádaba, where you will be able to catch sight of its majestic mediaeval castle. After Sádaba, the route enters deep inside the steppe and irrigated land of La Bardena, passing next to the colonist villages of Pinsoro, El Bayo, and Santa Anastasia, before the route ends in Ejea de los Caballeros.
