Las Pedrosas

There are landscapes and unexplored areas of the Cinco Villas district that you should discover on your road bike. This is why the proposed name of the route is Recóndita (Unexplored), as you will go deep into the countryside riding on local roads through solitary landscapes in the Wild West of Cinco Villas.

The route starts in Las Pedrosas and from there it heads north on a scenic local road to Piedratajada. When you reach the crossroads, you continue to Puendeluna, riding up a small mountain pass, which marks the start of the toughest climb. The route goes uphill and passes through Casas de Esper, to then descend to Valpalmas, where the distinguished Ramón y Cajal spent his childhood. The route continues on another local road that takes you deep into the countryside, not far from Aguarales de Valdemilaz, to head towards Piedratajada and Marracos.

In Marracos, there is a small climb before the path descends to the River Gállego, near Gurrea de Gállego. A very peaceful scenic stretch that is characteristic of this area, which passes through steppe.

From the crossroads the route continues along a main road to Las Pedrosas. This is the only stretch with a heavier traffic. A wild and accessible route for all kinds of cycle tourists who like riding on quiet roads through different landscapes. Pure slow cycling in the Wild West of the Cinco Villas.
